


Memorial Day Logic Puzzle

Kari, Nate, Susan, and Josh are exploring the cemetery as the adults decorate the graves for Memorial Day. They challenge each other to find the oldest date on a gravestone. Use the clues to match the kids with the dates they found: 1887, 1896, 1902, and 1911. Who won the challenge?

- 1. Susan's date was not in the most recent century.
- 2. Josh's date was 9 years older than Kari's.
- 3. Nate's date was an even number.





Use the grid, if you'd like, to eliminate possibilities. Put an "x" in a box if you know a date doesn't go with a person. Put an "o" if you know it does.
